Capitol City Rockets Info

The Capitol City Rockets is the Suburban Maryland, DC, and Northern Virginia chapter of the Oldsmobile Club of America. The Capitol City Rockets originated in 1989, and is currently operating in its 31st year. We split monthly meetings between Kilroy's Bar and Grille off the Braddock Road exit of 495 in Northern VA and the Hard Times Café in Rockville, MD, with one peer judged show co-hosted each year with the Metro Buick Club. The club currently consists of over 50 members, from Virginia, Maryland, Florida, and even DC and West Virginia. A membership form is located in the back of this newsletter. One need not own an Oldsmobile to join, and dues remain \$15 dollars per year, payable by November the 1st, either by check or using the PayPal button on our Hemmings.com website. Current membership in the Oldsmobile Club of America is a requirement of CCR membership, as we are required to submit rosters to OCA for yearly insurance coverage for our events.

We were concerned about damage under the rear bumper as well, but just found surface rust.



We wanted to preserve the original front fenders, and so this is what one looked like post patch.



We were really pleased about how the doors fit—a Fusick hinge repair kit and the sag was gone.

'69 F-85 Sports Coupe 'Mud Wasp' Paint & Body



One of the "must haves" requested by the Phillips boys (along with hood stripes) was a rear wing. Here, we are using the chassis manual specs to align it.



Any area that was unpainted got Metal Ready and POR15 treatment, you can see here on the underside of the hood and inside the fenders.

While visiting the shop where the '69 is currently quarantined, I got a full look at the potential that it possessed as it was the first time I'd seen it look so clean. I fell in love with the car all over again when my dad put the spoiler on it, making it that much harder to leave it for another two months. I am very excited to see it with a clean paint job on it, gleaming in the sun. Also while at the shop we put a lot of work into the (previously damaged) front driver-side fender, twisting, bending, and welding it so that it would fit cleanly and so the lines would be straight and sharp, making me appreciate the finished product even more.

Winter Club Meetings and 2020 Odds and Ends



I've been looking QuickJacks for years. I have a 20x20 suburban garage with normal electrical. Pretty simple assembly and works great with my low ceiling. 2 height settings with lock mechanism makes it safe.



Cool pic of Guy Steven's '68 442 as we exited the February meeting at Kilroy's. We had a big crowd and it was a great day to get the Olds out.

We had some amazing weather this winter on club meeting days (remember when it was 'okay' to gather with other people?). I wanted to take a minute to tout the QuickJack I finally purchased. I bought mine when Costco advertised it for \$999 back in December. (Lists for \$1199 this month in "Online Only" catalog.) It basically consists of two heavy, long scissor platforms with small wheels on one end for moving them about. Doable, but not super easy. Hydraulic fluid lines run from an electric pump to raise/lower the 2 lock system to a max height of 26" and hold up to 5000 lbs. Line assembly required. Hard, moveable rubber blocks protect your frame.



Lock cylinders, like these from the doors of our '69, are stamped with a code for rekeying. Ours also needed a little lube, and now turn freely. Joe P owns the key cutting tools.

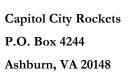
