Let's see... great location, delicious catering, a fun DJ, and professional photography to capture all the special moments comes to mind. Of course the guests of honor should arrive in style. Perhaps a limo? What about a 1973 Oldsmobile Cutlass Supreme!

That was the task put before me and my sisters as we wanted to deliver surprise and delight to our parents and guests of The Cotton's 50th Anniversary Celebration. Irby and Carolyn Cotton were married on February 16th, 1973. On their wedding day, Dad gifted Mother with a shiny new green Cutlass Supreme with a vinyl top. I can imagine Mother, beaming with that "new bride" glow as her husband presented a brand new car. "Wouldn't it be neat if we could arrive to the party in one?" My Mother thought.

The challenge was on! We made her promise not to put a deposit on any other transportation unless we couldn't find one. My Mother's fanciful idea became a real quest. Where do you begin tracking down a 50 year old Cutlass Supreme? You don't see these big machines out for a Sunday drive, pulling up next to your mini SUV at a stop light. Lokar Throttle & Kickdown Cable 200-4R I-6 Conversion

As many of you may have considered, this past fall we installed a built 200-4R transmission in our 1969 F-85. Brief history—in '69 if you got the base level F-85 (not the Cutlass or 442), you got the Chevy built 250 cubic inch Action Line 6 and the Super Turbine 300 two speed transmission (which some confuse with the Powerglide, but they are not the same) if you opted for an automatic transmission. As documented in a previous *Rocket Review Quarterly*, we decided to upgrade the Inline 6 in our F-85 to a 4 barrel Edelbrock 500 cfm setup using an Offenhauser intake scored at a Carlisle swap meet.

While we loved the four barrel upgrade, the trans felt sluggish behind it. Through OCA and Joe Padavano's recommendation, we worked with CK Performance in Brooklyn, NY to build the trans to not only work with the current engine, but also be stout enough so that if we decided at some point to install a V-8 it would handle the output. Joe had been kind enough to assist with the 4 barrel linkage, but with the 200-4R, it proved fairly problematic. The biggest issue being that in order to feed all 6 cylinders equally, the Edelbrock needed to be turned so that the throttle and trans linkage wrapped around the side, which is not ideal, but was a reality.


Fortunately, I like to spend my early winter weekend mornings watching mind-numbing car shows on *Motor Trend* and *Maverick TV*, and one morning on the *Lokar Garage* show, they had a feature on Lokar linkage kits. I have to tell you that after looking online at individual pieces and kits for both Throttle and Kickdown cables, I was super impressed. I was not only able to search by transmission type, but also by carburetor make/model and engine type—I saw right online at Lokar.com the exact linkage and cable kits I would need to make this work. For both the throttle and kickdown cables, bracketing, and all of the related hardware, I spent about \$300—not cheap, but the Lokar equipment is really well made, adjustable, and cables can be ordered and cut to size.

A few supporting pics on the install:

- 1—Joe P securing the throttle cable and checking range of travel.
- 2—You can see here the adjusting nuts to get full pedal range.
- 3—Side view of throttle (top) and kickdown (bottom) attached
- 4—Best part—stout Lokar alloy bracket that aligns and stabilizes all of the above, matched to the Edelbrock carb we are using.
- 5—Joe P trimming the throttle cable a bit after the test drive.

We cannot say enough as to how the 200-4R and the Lokar linkage have transformed the driving experience and performance of our '69. It is responsive immediately at the pedal, the trans provides power through the upshift that wasn't there before, and when it hits overdrive, the Action Line 6 now has plenty of get up on the highway. A pleasant surprise is it has significantly improved our gas mileage, from 12 to about 19 mpg. As you can tell, I'd highly recommend Lokar linkage! - Scott Phillips, Editor
